Canada supports industries across Arizona

Canadian companies are invested across all industries in Arizona. **Magellan Aerospace**, with operations in Glendale, provides complex assemblies and systems solutions for aircraft and engine manufacturers, as well as defense and space agencies worldwide. **CAE** is a worldwide partner of choice in civil and defense aviation and chose Phoenix for one of its flight schools to train pilots from U.S. airlines including **American**, **JetBlue**, and **Southwest**. Infrastructure companies like **EPCOR USA** provide clean water and safe, reliable energy to communities across the state. Some of the top financial service providers used by Arizonans are **BMO**, **City National Bank**, and **Sun Life U.S.** Similarly, Canadian consumer goods companies have set up shop in Arizona due to its business-friendly climate, including **Aldo**, **Circle K**, **Popeyes**, **Cold Stone Creamery** and **Lululemon Athletica**. Moreover, **Brookfield Infrastructure** invested up to \$15 billion for a 49% stake in **Intel's** manufacturing expansion at its Ocotillo campus in Chandler. Each of these Canadian companies demonstrate how a strong U.S.–Canada economic partnership helps drive Arizona's growth and local jobs.



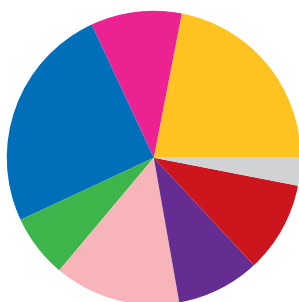

Magna's manufacturing in Arizona builds local jobs

Magna International Inc. is a Canadian parts manufacturer for automakers. It is one of the largest companies in Canada and was recognized on the 2020 Forbes Global 2000 list. Magna chose Arizona to establish a new autonomous vehicle (AV) manufacturing facility in Mesa, in partnership with **Waymo**. The multi-million-dollar facility will create hundreds of jobs, supporting Waymo's efforts to scale its autonomous ride-hailing service. The plant will be capable of manufacturing tens of thousands of robotaxis annually once fully operational. It's an example of how Canadian business partnerships create jobs in Arizona and keep North America globally competitive.

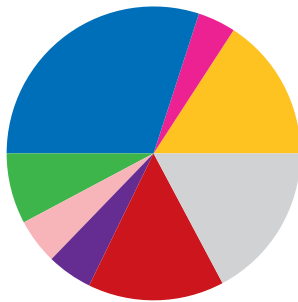
Canadian travel to Arizona supports jobs and local industries

More than 800,000 Canadians travel to Arizona annually, drawn by the state's warm climate, outdoor lifestyle, and welcoming communities. Every year, more than 100,000 Canadian Snowbirds choose Arizona as their seasonal or long term home, forming one of the most vibrant cross border communities in the United States. Canadians who visit have made Arizona their second home. They are the largest group of foreign homeowners in the state, a testament to how deeply they are woven into the fabric of local neighborhoods. This steady flow of people, investment, and economic activity has helped create a uniquely strong partnership between Arizona and Canada. It's a relationship that supports jobs, strengthens local industries, and reinforces the deep ties that make our two countries not just neighbors, but close and enduring partners.
