### Strengthening Canada-U.S. Defense & Interoperability

**\$2 billion AEGIS SPY-7 investment** enhances Canada's naval capabilities and reinforces NATO commitments.

**Seamless interoperability** with U.S. and NATO allies ensures collective security in the North Atlantic and Indo-Pacific regions.

**Advanced multi-domain defense capabilities:** air & missile defense, anti-submarine warfare, and electronic warfare.

### Supporting U.S. Industry & Innovation

**Investment in developing new technologies** for this project fuels U.S. defense innovation, sustaining high-value jobs in Moorestown, NJ, Tucson, AZ, Washington, DC and Marlboro, MA.

**Strengthening the U.S. defense industrial base** through Canada's procurement of AN/SPY-7 radar via the Foreign Military Sales program.

**Strategic alignment:** This collaboration lays the groundwork for future U.S.-Canada defense partnerships.

Canada's National Shipbuilding Strategy has expanded Canada's fleet for North American security; strengthened fleet readiness in support of NATO, continental defense and joint Canada-U.S. security operations; and, boosted economic and industrial growth – investing in shipbuilding technology and workforce development.
